**7:00 PM** – Supervisor opened the meeting and asked newly married Sgt. James Janso of the Town of Lloyd Police Department to lead the Pledge of Allegiance.

### 1. OLD BUSINESS

There is no old business to be discussed in this meeting.

### 2. NEW BUSINESS

**A.** Town Clerk – present the Tentative 2013 Budget to the Town Board

Rosaria Peplow, Town Clerk, presented the Tentative 2013 Budget, as prepared by the Chief Fiscal Officer to the Town Board and commented that the Board members have received the tentative budget electronically. She asked that anyone who wanted a copy of the budget sent electronically to give her their email address.

### 3. RESOLUTIONS & MOTIONS

**A. MOTION** made by Brennie, seconded by Guerriero, to authorize the use of the Hudson Valley Rail Trail parking area at 75 Haviland Road and the Hudson Valley Rail Trail parking area at 100 Haviland Road on Friday, October 5 from 4:00 PM to 10:00 PM for the Walkway over the Hudson event, “Starry, Starry Night”, as requested by Walkway over the Hudson.

**B. RESOLUTION** made by Brennie, seconded by Paladino, to hire Christine Giangrasso as part-time receptionist with typing at the Water/Wastewater Department at a salary of \$13.16 per hour, pending pre-employment physical.

**Roll call:** Guerriero, aye; Hansut, aye; Paladino, aye; Brennie, aye.

**Four ayes carried.**

*Supervisor thanked everyone for coming to the meeting and said that it is a pleasure to appoint the new Police Chief for the Town of Lloyd; he noted that the Town is moving into a new era which he believes will be good for both the Town and the Police Department. This individual began his career with the Police Department as a dispatcher and patrolman; he represented the Town on the URGENT team with distinction and he put together great cases with the URGENT team.*

*He then addressed members of the URGENT team and said that he appreciated what they have done for the community. He thanked them for their efforts and said that he hoped that the relationship between the Town and URGENT continues.*

**C. RESOLUTION** made by Paladino, seconded by Brennie, to appoint Daniel R. Waage as Chief of Police of the Town of Lloyd Police Department, from the Ulster County Civil Service List of Eligibles, effective October 1, 2012, and to authorize the Supervisor to sign the labor agreement.

*He then said, "I would like to thank Supervisor Hansut and the members of the Town Board for bestowing such a great honor upon me. I promise that when you look back you will be proud of the decisions I have made. I began my law enforcement career as a dispatcher at the Town of Lloyd Police Department and went on to become a part-time police officer, a full-time police officer, Police Sergeant and now the Chief of Police. I did not do this all on my own; my family and friends have always been extremely supportive of me. I have met some great people along the way in law enforcement who have always been there for me. I have also had the great opportunity to work with the URGENT team and have been blessed to work with some of the best law enforcement that this county has to offer.*

*I would also like to address my department members. It is my great honor to be able to call myself the Chief of Police of such fine men and women. I look forward to sitting down with you all and speaking about my vision of our department (and I mean 'our' department).*

*It is also my honor to serve the citizens of the Town of Lloyd as I have done throughout my entire career.*

*Again, thank you all for coming. The PBA has graciously provided refreshments to have a get together in the Community Room, next to the Police Department, following this meeting." He invited all to attend.*

Supervisor remarked, "Congratulations, God bless you and God bless all of the men and women in this room tonight".
